Graduate Program in Health Course Typology

Core*	Core courses ensure that all graduate students gain a common and foundational understanding of the different aspects of health policy and equity studies. REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS. <i>Note:</i> Upon discussion with and approval of supervisor and GPD, Graduate Research Methods can be replaced with equivalent credits if student completed equivalent graduate level coursework
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Field specific**	Field specific courses offer an overview of broad perspectives in health policy and equity studies. TWO 3.0 COURSES ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS. Selection depends on student's interests and course offerings on a given year. All field specific courses can be taken as elective WHEN NOT USED TOWARDS MEETING A FIELD SPECIFIC REQUIREMENT.
Elective ***	<p>Any course in the Graduate Program in Health NOT TAKEN TO FILL A CORE OR FIELD SPECIFIC REQUIREMENT will be considered "elective". All students must take a certain number of elective credits that depend on DEGREE PURSUED (MA or PhD) and ADMISSIONS CATEGORY IN THE CASE OF PHD STUDENTS (e.g., accepted for PhD with an MA from York Graduate Program in Health, an MA from another program, or non-standard applicant).</p> <p>Students are encouraged to take a maximum of one 3.0 credit course elective (or two for PhD students with a York MA in Health) from another graduate program at York, contingent on student's specific intellectual/research interests, upon discussion with and approval of supervisor and GPD.</p>
